Program Summary

International arbitration is developing ever more quickly in Latin America. The number of arbitration cases is on the rise, regional arbitration centers are established, and new laws on international arbitration are enacted. These developments mean new opportunities for practitioners and students who wish to specialise in this field. They also mean the need for practitioners already in the field to keep up with change.

The Curriculum is organized in a 3 weeks online course and consists of a General Course, 7 Thematic Courses, and 4 arbitration lectures.

Who is this program for?

- Lawyers in private practice and in-house counsels wishing to develop their arbitration knowledge, and international background;
- Government and public sector officials, such as treaty negotiators and drafters or in-house State lawyers working in areas of dispute settlement;
- Advanced law students enrolled in a postgraduate degree, or PhD candidates.

- Acquire a general understanding of procedural and substantive matters in commercial and investment arbitration.
- Acquire in depth practical knowledge in specialized sectors of international arbitration, such as construction and sports
